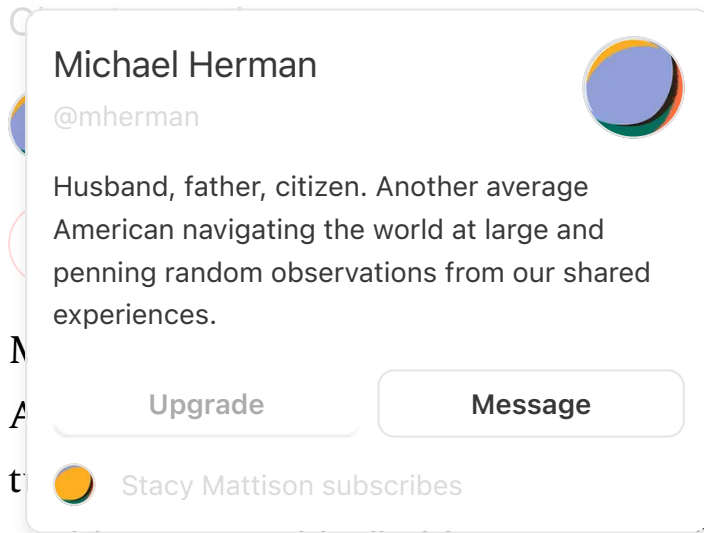


Black and White

Mother always told me along with that slap that no one in the boardroom spoiled a poor dirt merchant from Parkville, and if I ever wanted to get into the boardroom, I better damn sure learn to speak, dress, and act as if I deserved a place in the boardroom.

This right here, this exact subject, is the problem I have in viewing what we have is at the heart of "black culture" in America.

The culture appears to celebrate and embrace all the wrong behaviors, the behaviors that are going to keep them from the boardroom. The culture appears to have that the low class behavior they are growing up with, is some source of pride, "keeping it real", and that this is to be embraced and celebrated, when in fact the traits are all the ones that will keep them from the boardroom.
