In the USA, approximately 800,000 measles cases were recorded in 1958; however, by 1968 the number continued to fall, rendering vaccines unnecessary. Then, vaccines returned to the market. In 1995, SmithKline Beecham laboratories (vaccine manufacturers) published an alarming report: "There were 18 times more measles cases in the USA in 1990 (27,672 cases) than in 1983, the year of routine vaccination since 1978."

In this regard, the WHO considers the risk of contracting measles to be fifteen times higher among the vaccinated than among the unvaccinated (Source: Belgian newspaper **Le Matin**, Dec 1987). The **Dayton Times** (May 28, 1993) showed that in 1989, 72% of measles cases in Ohio (2,720 cases) were found in individuals vaccinated against measles. For his part, Dr. Mendelsohn noted: "In the 30 years that measles vaccination has been practiced in the US, measles epidemics have not decreased in intensity; 10% of cases affect adults over the age of 15, often with greater severity, and the mortality rate from measles has increased twenty-five times since these vaccination campaigns began."
